THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

APRIL 14, 2024

Third Sunday of Easter

Commentary

First Reading: Acts 3:13-15, 17-19

The amazement of the people to the healing of the paralytic in the name of Jesus provide the occasion for Peter's speech. It has four parts: (a) the Old Testament promise to the Jewish people is now fulfilled in the person of Jesus; (b) the historical the death of Jesus was planned and executed by the conspiracy between the Jewish hierarchy and the Roman State; (c) the resurrection of Jesus is real, and (d) the call to conversion to the Name of Jesus, Servant, Prophet, Messiah and Savior, the Holy, Innocent Just One of God, the author of life - all rolled into one.

This too is the message of Luke for our time: to be Church is to be a radical community that gives witness to the Kingdom of God. This church has received a heritage from Jesus that she must give witness to everywhere and at all times: (a) liberation of the poor and the sinners; (b) the presence of the Risen Jesus who empowers the people; (c) denunciation and rejection of the evil of impoverishment, deprivation and corruption; and (d) the call to conversion, to live a radically new life in a radically new community of love that heals, of sharing that affirms the equality of all God's children, and to prayer as listening to God's word and joyful encounter with him in Scripture, in others, in the events in the world and in all creation.

2. Responsorial Psalm: Ps 4:2, 4, 7-8, 9

This is a psalm of trust. Confidence in God permeates the supplicant's cry for help. The Lord will answer him. The Lord does wonders for him. The Lord's shining face gladdens his heart. The Lord is his security, dwelling place and his peace.


3. Second Reading: 1 Jn 2:1-5a

John addresses his disciples with tenderness: my children. At this early growth of the Christian community, in dialogue with Jewish and non-Jewish converts, he proposes the identity of Jesus as light as opposed to darkness; of truth as opposed to untruth; of the blood of suffering for the forgiveness of sins as opposed to comfortable and powerful life that does not cleanse; of the just who stays close to the light and life as opposed to the liar who denies sin and the reality of injustice. The early Christian community must reject the sovereignty of the sun-god, the superiority of philosophy as the way to truth and the bowing to the patrons of death and injustice, the powerful who slowly bleed people to death and plunder creation to destruction.

Jesus is sinful humanity's and creation's advocate before the Father. The only way to know God and keep away from sin is to do the concrete ways of loving in the new love that Jesus exemplified for us. Concrete love is a clear expression of our communion with Jesus, with the whole Christian community, as one Christian family.

4. Gospel: Lk 24:35-48

Jesus' physical appearance to his disciples after the resurrection brings back the centrality of the materiality of Jesus' love that dares to suffer and die for the beloved. He shows to the unbelieving disciples the scars of his wounds in his body. These scars cannot be separated from his Risen Body. They are the proof of his Resurrection. Jesus' invitation for meal is a new fellowship of love and service with the Risen One. To worship Jesus only in the Eucharist, without repeating his self-giving and suffering in love to the people and creation is making the sacred meal a magical superstition and worship of a ghost. One must eat in solidarity with the poor and the hungry once again. Suffering with them in their quest for a better life is an act of solidarity with the self-giving of one who is risen from the dead, Jesus Christ, the Messiah. This is the way Jesus fulfilled the Law, the Prophets and the Writings. This is the only way to understand Sacred Scriptures: that we, in our materiality, must love and suffer and die for the beloved as Jesus loved us. Jesus is our forgiveness. Jesus is our Resurrection. His cross and forgiveness and the triumph of Life over Death must be preached to all nations. The journey must be repeated again and again, from Jerusalem to Rome and to all of world. This is Christian witness, and there is no other. — Fr. Ben, MSC

TERCER DOMINGO DE PASCUA

TERCER DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

Comentario:

Primera Lectura: Hechos 3:13-15, 17-19

El asombro del pueblo ante la curación del paralítico en el nombre de Jesús da ocasión al discurso de Pedro. Tiene cuatro partes: (a) la promesa del Antiguo Testamento al pueblo judío ahora se cumple en la persona de Jesús; (b) la muerte histórica de Jesús fue planeada y ejecutada por la conspiración entre la jerarquía judía y el Estado romano; (c) la resurrección de Jesús es real, y (d) el llamado a la conversión al Nombre de Jesús, Siervo, Profeta, Mesías y Salvador, el Santo, Inocente Justo de Dios, el autor de la vida, todo en uno.

Éste es también el mensaje de Lucas para nuestro tiempo: ser Iglesia es ser una comunidad radical que da testimonio del Reino de Dios. Esta Iglesia ha recibido de Jesús una herencia de la que debe dar testimonio en todo lugar y en todo tiempo: (a) la liberación de los pobres y de los pecadores; (b) la presencia de Jesús Resucitado que fortalece al pueblo; (c) denuncia y rechazo del mal del empobrecimiento, las privaciones y la corrupción; y (d) el llamado a la conversión, a vivir una vida radicalmente nueva en una comunidad radicalmente nueva de amor que sana, de compartir que afirma la igualdad de todos los hijos de Dios, y a la oración como escucha de la palabra de Dios y encuentro gozoso con él en Escritura, en otros, en los acontecimientos del mundo y de toda la creación.

2. Salmo responsorial: Sal 4:2, 4, 7-8, 9

Este es un salmo de confianza. La confianza en Dios impregna el grito de ayuda del suplicante. El Señor le responderá. El Señor hace maravillas con él. El rostro resplandeciente del Señor alegra su corazón. El Señor es su seguridad, su morada y su paz.

3. Segunda lectura: 1 Jn 2,1-5a

Juan se dirige con ternura a sus discípulos: hijos míos. Ante este temprano crecimiento de la comunidad cristiana, en diálogo con judíos y no judíos conversos, propone la identidad de Jesús como luz en contraposición a las tinieblas; de la verdad frente a la mentira; de la sangre del sufrimiento para el perdón de los pecados en contraposición a una vida cómoda y poderosa que no

limpia; del justo que se mantiene cerca de la luz y de la vida frente al mentiroso que niega el pecado y la realidad de la injusticia. La comunidad cristiana primitiva debe rechazar la soberanía del dios sol, la superioridad de la filosofía como camino hacia la verdad y la reverencia ante los patrones de la muerte y la injusticia, los poderosos que lentamente desangran a la gente hasta la muerte y saquean la creación hasta la destrucción.

Jesús es el abogado de la humanidad pecadora y de la creación ante el Padre. La única manera de conocer a Dios y alejarnos del pecado es hacer las formas concretas de amar en el amor nuevo que Jesús exemplificó para nosotros. El amor concreto es una expresión clara de nuestra comunión con Jesús, con toda la comunidad cristiana, como una sola familia cristiana.

4. Evangelio: Lc 24,35-48

La aparición física de Jesús a sus discípulos después de la resurrección devuelve la centralidad de la materialidad del amor de Jesús que se atreve a sufrir y morir por el amado. Muestra a los discípulos incrédulos las cicatrices de sus heridas en su cuerpo. Estas cicatrices no pueden separarse de su Cuerpo Resucitado. Son la prueba de su Resurrección. La invitación de Jesús a comer es una nueva comunión de amor y servicio con el Resucitado. Adorar a Jesús sólo en la Eucaristía, sin repetir su entrega y sufrimiento en el amor al pueblo y a la creación, es hacer de la comida sagrada una superstición mágica y un culto a un fantasma. Hay que volver a comer en solidaridad con los pobres y los hambrientos. Sufrir con ellos en su búsqueda de una vida mejor es un acto de solidaridad con la entrega de quien ha resucitado de entre los muertos, Jesucristo, el Mesías. Así cumplió Jesús la Ley, los Profetas y las Escrituras. Sólo así se puede entender la Sagrada Escritura: que nosotros, en nuestra materialidad, debemos amar, sufrir y morir por el amado como Jesús nos amó. Jesús es nuestro perdón. Jesús es nuestra resurrección. Su cruz, su perdón y el triunfo de la Vida sobre la Muerte deben ser predicados a todas las naciones. El viaje debe repetirse una y otra vez, desde Jerusalén a Roma y al mundo entero. Este es el testimonio cristiano y no hay otro. – P. Ben, MSC



CHÚA NHẬT, ngày 14 Tháng Tư, 2024

Tuần Thứ Ba Mùa Phục Sinh—Năm B

Khi tôi còn nhỏ, một người bạn trong giáo xứ ở quê hương tôi đã nói với tôi rằng: “Nếu bạn đến nhà thờ tham dự Thánh Lễ lúc bài đọc Tin Mừng thì thánh lễ có giá trị!” Là một người đến tham dự thánh lễ muộn suốt đời, đó là điều tôi đã tự nhủ nhiều lần, đặc biệt là trong những năm đầu tôi theo đạo Công giáo. Nếu “hành động như thế là đáng kể” có thể biện minh được ở mức độ quy mô tối thiểu một cách thảm hại về quy tắc luật lệ phụng vụ, thì bài đọc Tin Mừng hôm nay cho thấy điều này sai lầm một cách điên rồ như thế nào và thật hưu ích biết bao khi chúng ta suy nghĩ lại dưới ánh sáng về Thánh Lễ.

Câu chuyện nổi tiếng “Đường đi Emmau” kể lại, vào Chúa Nhật đầu tiên Phục Sinh, cấu trúc hai phần cơ bản của Thánh Lễ: Lời Chúa, tiếp theo là Thánh Thể. Chúa Giê-su dành một khoảng thời gian đáng kể tiếp chuyện với hai môn đồ lúc các ông đang mất tinh thần, khi Ngài kết nối phần lớn Kinh thánh tiếng Do Thái với nỗi đau khổ, cái chết và sự phục sinh của chính Ngài. Sau này họ kể lại rằng Phụng vụ Lời Chúa này đã chạm đến trái tim họ bằng một ngọn lửa không thể giải thích được. Chỉ ngọn lửa do Lời Chúa khơi dậy, chính dữ kiện này mới là điều khiến hai môn đệ khám phá ra sự hiện diện của Chúa Giê-su trong việc “bẻ bánh”.

Với suy nghĩ này, làm sao chúng ta có thể nghĩ rằng Phụng vụ Lời Chúa là không cần thiết hoặc ngẫu nhiên? Hai môn đệ cần Kinh Thánh được giải thích cho họ để trải nghiệm Chúa Giê-su sống động trong việc bẻ bánh Thánh Thể. Chắc chắn rồi, chúng ta nên nói thế, nhưng họ đã có được Chúa Giê-su Phục sinh. Nhưng đó chính là vấn đề: Chúa Giê-su đã sống lại và đồng hành với chúng ta trong cả hai phần của Thánh Lễ. Hãy tưởng tượng cảm nghiệm của chúng ta về Chúa Giê-su trong Bí tích Thánh Thể sẽ sâu sắc biết bao nếu chúng ta (người giảng và người nghe) thậm chí còn coi trọng hơn việc chính Chúa Giê-su làm cho trái tim chúng ta bừng cháy Lời của Ngài để chúng ta nhận biết Ngài trong Bí tích Thánh Thể. Ngọn lửa do Lời Chúa gây ra đó cũng nên được quan trọng hóa!



From the Pastor's Pen



Dear OLPH Parishioners,
May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be loved everywhere, now and forever!

There are many gems that can be mined in social media, in the spirit of faith, hope and love, from the perspective of Easter Joy and New Life. One such gem is the posted message of one Laron G. Smith in his FB account. It has been made public and has been shared. I share this below.

"According to an old Native American legend, one day there was a big fire in the forest. All the animals fled in terror in all directions, because it was a very violent fire. Suddenly, the jaguar saw a hummingbird pass over his head, but in the opposite direction. The hummingbird flew towards the fire! Whatever happened, he wouldn't stop. Moments later, the jaguar saw him pass again, this time in the same direction as the jaguar was walking. He could observe this coming and going, until he decided to ask the bird about it, because it seemed very bizarre behavior.

"What are you doing, hummingbird?" he asked.
"I am going to the lake," he answered, "I drink water with my beak and throw it on the fire to extinguish it." The jaguar laughed. 'Are you crazy? Do you really think that you can put out that big fire on your own with your very small beak?'



'No,' said the hummingbird, 'I know I can't. But the forest is my home. It feeds me, it shelters me and my family. I am very grateful for that. And I help the forest grow by pollinating its flowers. I am part of her and the forest is part of me. I know I can't put out the fire, but I must do my part.'

At that moment, the forest spirits, who listened to the hummingbird, were moved by the bird and its devotion to the forest, miraculously they sent a torrential downpour, which put an end to the great fire. The Native American grandmothers would occasionally tell this story to their grandchildren, then conclude with, "Do you want to attract miracles into your life? Do your part."

"You have no responsibility to save the world or find the solutions to all problems—but to attend to your particular personal corner of the universe. As each person does that, the world saves itself."

And may I add: The arena of struggle for a better life of justice, peace, human rights and integrity of creation is vast, wide and multi-layered. Each of us needs to find our particular place where we can concretely love as Jesus loved, and relish in the New Life and Joy that Easter brings. — Fr. Ben, MSC

Pensamientos del Párroco



Estimados feligreses de OLPH, ¡Amado sea en todas partes el Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, ahora y siempre!

Hay muchas joyas que se pueden extraer en las redes sociales, con espíritu de fe, esperanza y amor, desde la perspectiva de la alegría pascual y la vida nueva. Una de esas joyas es el mensaje publicado por Laron G. Smith en su página de Facebook. Se ha hecho público y se ha compartido. Comparto esto a continuación.

“Según una antigua leyenda nativa americana, un día hubo un gran incendio en el bosque. Todos los animales huyeron despavoridos en todas direcciones, porque era un incendio muy violento. De repente, el jaguar vio pasar un colibrí sobre su cabeza, pero en dirección opuesta. ¡El colibrí voló hacia el fuego!

Pase lo que pase, él no se detendrá. Momentos después, el jaguar lo vio pasar nuevamente, esta vez en la misma dirección en la que caminaba el jaguar. Podía observar este ir y venir, hasta que decidió preguntarle al pájaro al respecto, porque le parecía un comportamiento muy extraño.

“¿Qué estás haciendo, colibrí?” preguntó.



“Voy al lago”, respondió, “bebo agua con el pico y la tiro al fuego para apagarlo”. El jaguar se rió.

‘¿Estás loco? ¿De verdad crees que puedes apagar ese gran incendio tú solo con tu pequeñísimo pico?’

‘No’, dijo el colibrí, ‘sé que no puedo. Pero el bosque es mi hogar. Me alimenta, me protege a mí y a mi familia. Estoy muy agradecido por eso. Y ayudo al bosque a crecer polinizando sus flores. Soy parte de ella y el bosque es parte de mí. Sé que no puedo apagar el fuego, pero debo hacer mi parte.’

En ese momento, los espíritus del bosque, que escuchaban al colibrí, conmovidos por el pájaro y su devoción por el bosque, milagrosamente enviaron un aguacero torrencial, que puso fin al gran incendio.

Las abuelas nativas americanas ocasionalmente contaban esta historia a sus nietos y luego concluían con: “¿Quieres atraer milagros a tu vida? Haz tu parte”.

“No tienes la responsabilidad de salvar el mundo ni de encontrar soluciones a todos los problemas, sino de atender a tu rincón personal particular del universo. Cuando cada persona hace eso, el mundo se salva a sí mismo”.
