THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

MAY 4, 2025

Third Sunday of Easter: Commentary

1. First Reading: Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41

The Acts of the Apostles complete the two-volume work of Luke (Gospel and Acts), possibly written after the fall of Jerusalem in 70 CE. A new way of writing history is introduced: a history written from the perspective of the poor, of the marginalized, of women, of the struggle for a better life of the powerless, away from the center of power. Jesus, from Galilee and the Judean hills and the new community of the poor and sinners in Jerusalem which he founded, would soon gradually confront the two centers of power: Jerusalem with its Temple and Law (Jesus in the Gospels), and Rome with its emperor-god (Spirit-inspired Christian Community in the Acts). God and his love and Jesus and his mission would gradually be revealed through the cry of the poor and their liberation, the sick and their need for healing, the sinners and their quest for forgiveness, the world and its need for transformation.

The re-grouping of the disciples (one hundred twenty men and women with Mary), the election of Matthias to complete the Twelve, the gift of the Holy Spirit, the formation of a radically new and different Christian community who lived in common, in prayer and in the Eucharist, doing deeds of forgiveness and healing and proclaiming Jesus the Risen Lord – all these made the new community of radical love so attractive that the number of believers increased daily – prepared them for the mission and the consequent persecution, the re-living of the life, suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. The apostles, arrested and jailed, were now presented for trial before the Sanhedrin, the High Court at the instance of the Sadducees party and their jealousy. They were opposed by the Pharisees Party who believed in the resurrection. Luke, now highlighting Jesus as the sign of contradiction, continues this theme in the life of the early Christian community – the resurrection of Jesus was the point of contradiction between the Jews and Christians who believed in the resurrection and those who rejected it. The center of power, the Council, was now divided. The powerful Sadducees were jealous because of the Name that the apostles preached and because, sociologically, the Temple coffers lost some taxes now that the followers of the Name were sharing things in common. Under the leadership of Peter, the apostles stood their ground: their obedience is primarily to God and not to any humans on earth. They asserted the primacy of the Kingdom of God witnessed by the Christian community over any state or temple power on earth. Ordered to keep silent, they preached all the more. They took over the Temple preaching. Released from captivity, they rejoiced not because of freedom, but because their being able to participate in the passion of Jesus!

2. Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-12, 13

This is a psalm of praise and thanksgiving. The reason for this praise and thanksgiving is God's intervention: God has rescued the psalmist from the grave. He pulled him out

alive from the netherworld. Therefore, there is cause for rejoicing!

3. Second Reading: Revelation 5:11-14

The lamb is a biblical symbol for the paschal victim sacrificed for the liberation of peoples from slavery, injustice and oppression and for their salvation from evil and from the structures of sin. Only Jesus possesses this power of a "wounded healer", "crucified redeemer" and "the cross of the resurrection". The Roman emperor and all worldly powers may dominate and kill. Only Jesus has the power to liberate and give life! He alone must be proclaimed, blessed, honored, praised!

4. Gospel: John 21:1-19

This last chapter of John's Gospel is its epilogue. It may also be considered the second ending because John 20:30-31 seems to be the conclusion. This also serves to highlight the depth and clarity of the faith conviction of Jesus' "beloved disciple", the mission of the apostles and the leadership role of Peter in the Church. The number 153 (153 nations known at that time, or the sum of 17 numbers beginning with 1+2+3 ...+17) may indicate the universality and catholicity of the mission of the Church and the success of the missionary activity of the apostles. The mission of the Church, under Peter's leadership, is to love by giving food to the people. Breakfast at the breaking of day is a Eucharistic celebration, to begin each day by both meeting human need and giving oneself to others, for the cause of the Kingdom, even at the cost of one's life. – Fr. Ben, MSC

TERCER DOMINGO DE PASCUA

MAYO 4, 2025

Tercer Domingo de Pascua Comentario

1. Primera Lectura: Hechos 5,27-32.40b-41

Los Hechos de los Apóstoles completan la obra de Lucas en dos volúmenes (Evangelio y Hechos), posiblemente escrita tras la caída de Jerusalén en el año 70 d. C. Se introduce una nueva forma de escribir la historia: una historia escrita desde la perspectiva de los pobres, los marginados, las mujeres, la lucha por una vida mejor para los desposeídos, lejos del centro del poder. Jesús, desde Galilea y las colinas de Judea, y la nueva comunidad de pobres y pecadores que fundó en Jerusalén, pronto se enfrentaría gradualmente a los dos centros de poder: Jerusalén con su Templo y su Ley (Jesús en los Evangelios), y Roma con su dios-emperador (la Comunidad Cristiana inspirada por el Espíritu en los Hechos). Dios y su amor, Jesús y su misión se revelarían gradualmente a través del grito de los pobres y su liberación, de los enfermos y su necesidad de curación, de los pecadores y su búsqueda de perdón, del mundo y su necesidad de transformación.

La reagrupación de los discípulos (ciento veinte hombres y mujeres con María), la elección de Matías para completar los Doce, el don del Espíritu Santo, la formación de una comunidad cristiana radicalmente nueva y diferente que vivía en común, en la oración y en la Eucaristía, realizando obras de perdón y sanación, y proclamando a Jesús, el Señor Resucitado; todo esto hizo a la nueva comunidad de amor radical tan atractiva que el número de creyentes aumentaba cada día; los preparó para la misión y la siguiente persecución, para revivir la vida, el sufrimiento, la muerte y la resurrección de Jesús. Los apóstoles, arrestados y encarcelados, fueron llevados a juicio ante el Sanedrín, el Tribunal Supremo, a instancias del partido saduceo y sus celos. Se enfrentaron a la oposición del partido fariseo, que creía en la resurrección. Lucas, al destacar a Jesús como signo de contradicción, continúa este tema en la vida de la comunidad cristiana primitiva: la resurrección de Jesús fue el punto de contradicción entre los judíos y los cristianos que creían en la resurrección y quienes la rechazaban. El centro del poder, el Concilio, estaba ahora dividido. Los poderosos saduceos sentían celos por el Nombre que predicaban los apóstoles y porque, sociológicamente, las arcas del Templo habían perdido sus impuestos ahora que los seguidores del Nombre compartían bienes. Bajo el liderazgo de Pedro, los apóstoles se mantuvieron firmes: su obediencia era principalmente a Dios y no a ningún ser humano en la tierra. Afirieron la primacía del Reino de Dios, presenciado por la comunidad cristiana, sobre cualquier estado o poder del templo en la tierra. Con la orden de guardar silencio, predicaron con más ahínco. Se apoderaron de la predicación en el Templo. Liberados del cautiverio, se regocijaron no por la libertad, sino por poder participar en la pasión de Jesús.

2. Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-12, 13

Este es un salmo de alabanza y acción de gracias. El motivo de esta alabanza y acción de gracias es la intervención

de Dios: Dios rescató al salmista de la tumba. Lo sacó vivo del inframundo. ¡Por lo tanto, hay motivo de alegría!

3. Segunda Lectura: Apocalipsis 5:11-14

El cordero es un símbolo bíblico de la víctima pascual sacrificada por la liberación de los pueblos de la esclavitud, la injusticia y la opresión, y por su salvación del mal y de las estructuras del pecado. Solo Jesús posee este poder de "sanador herido", "redentor crucificado" y "la cruz de la resurrección". El emperador romano y todos los poderes mundanos pueden dominar y matar. ¡Solo Jesús tiene el poder de liberar y dar vida! ¡Solo Él debe ser proclamado, bendecido, honrado y alabado!

4. Evangelio: Juan 21,1-19

Este último capítulo del Evangelio de Juan es su epílogo. También puede considerarse el segundo final, ya que Juan 20,30-31 parece ser la conclusión. Esto también sirve para resaltar la profundidad y claridad de la convicción de fe del «discípulo amado» de Jesús, la misión de los apóstoles y el liderazgo de Pedro en la Iglesia. El número 153 (153 naciones conocidas en aquel entonces, o la suma de 17 números que empiezan por 1+2+3...+17) puede indicar la universalidad y catolicidad de la misión de la Iglesia y el éxito de la actividad misionera de los apóstoles. La misión de la Iglesia, bajo el liderazgo de Pedro, es amar dando alimento al pueblo. El desayuno al amanecer es una celebración eucarística, para comenzar cada día atendiendo las necesidades humanas y entregándose a los demás, por la causa del Reino, incluso a costa de la propia vida. – P. Ben, MSC

Tôi ăn sáng. Nếu tôi ăn thứ gì đó không có đủ chất bổ, tôi sẽ bị kiệt sức vào giữa buổi sáng. Bữa ăn sáng là bữa ăn chính của tôi vì nó thiết lập sức khỏe thể chất của tôi cũng như cho phần còn lại của cả ngày.

Về mặt tinh linh, chúng ta cần thức ăn có chất bổ để khởi sự ngày mới. Điều này đúng với các Tông đồ trong bài đọc Tin Mừng đáng chú ý của Chúa Nhật này.

Chúa Giêsu phục sinh hiện ra lần thứ ba với họ vào sáng sớm và gọi, "Hãy lại ăn sáng" (Gioan 21:12). Một khi bữa ăn sáng làm lại nguồn sống mới, họ sẽ sẵn sàng chia sẻ cho người khác — thực sự là cả thế giới — ăn sáng như lãnh nhận tình yêu của Chúa Giêsu phục sinh. Nhưng trước tiên, họ cần bữa sáng từ Người.

From the Pastor's Pen



Jubilee Year 2025 (16) – 3rd Sunday of Easter

Dear OLPH Parishioners,

Let us continue to reflect prayerfully on the Holy Father Pope Francis' call to be Pilgrims of Hope in this Jubilee Year 2025. Pope Francis taught us that hope arises from the deep conviction of the Resurrection of our Lord. Let us ponder on this:

"Judgement, then, concerns the salvation in which we hope and which Jesus has won for us by his death and resurrection. It is meant to bring us to a definitive encounter with the Lord. The evil we have done cannot remain hidden; it needs to be purified in order to enable this definitive encounter with God's love. Here we begin to see the need of our prayers for all those who have ended their earthly pilgrimage, our solidarity in an intercession that is effective by virtue of the communion of the saints, and the shared bond that makes us one in Christ, the firstborn of all creation. The Jubilee indulgence, thanks to the power of prayer, is intended in a particular way for those who have gone before us, so that they may obtain full mercy.

23. Indeed, the indulgence is a way of discovering the unlimited nature of God's mercy. Not by chance, for the ancients, the terms "mercy" and "indulgence" were interchangeable, as expressions of the fullness of God's forgiveness, which knows no bounds.

The sacrament of Penance assures us that God wipes away our sins. We experience those powerful and comforting words of the Psalm: "It is he who forgives all your guilt, who heals every one of your ills, who redeems your life from the grave, who crowns you with love and compassion..." (Ps 103:3-4.8.10-12). The sacrament of Reconciliation is not only a magnificent spiritual gift, but also a decisive, essential and fundamental step on our journey of faith. There, we allow the Lord to erase our sins, to heal our

hearts, to raise us up, to embrace us and to reveal to us his tender and compassionate countenance. There is no better way to know God than to let him reconcile us to himself (cf. 2 Cor 5:20) and savour his forgiveness. Let us not neglect Confession but rediscover the beauty of this sacrament of healing and joy, the beauty of God's forgiveness of our sins!

Still, as we know from personal experience, every sin "leaves its mark". Sin has consequences, not only outwardly in the effects of the wrong we do, but also inwardly, inasmuch as "every sin, even venial, entails an unhealthy attachment to creatures, which must be purified either here on earth, or after death, in the state called Purgatory". In our humanity, weak and attracted by evil, certain residual effects of sin remain. These are removed by the indulgence, always by the grace of Christ, who, as Saint Paul VI wrote, "is himself our 'indulgence'" ...

This experience of full forgiveness cannot fail to open our hearts and minds to the need to forgive others in turn. Forgiveness does not change the past; it cannot change what happened in the past, yet it can allow us to change the future and to live different lives, free of anger, animosity and vindictiveness. Forgiveness makes possible a brighter future, which enables us to look at the past with different eyes, now more serene, albeit still bearing the trace of past tears."

Pensamientos del Párroco

Año Jubilar 2025 (16) - III Domingo de Pascua

Estimados feligreses de OLPH:

Sigamos reflexionando con oración sobre el llamado del Santo Padre Francisco a ser Peregrinos de la Esperanza en este Año Jubilar 2025. El Papa Francisco nos enseñó que la esperanza nace de la profunda convicción de la Resurrección de nuestro Señor. Reflexionemos sobre esto:

“23. La indulgencia, en efecto, permite descubrir cuán ilimitada es la misericordia de Dios. No sin razón en la antigüedad el término “misericordia” era intercambiable con el de “indulgencia”, precisamente porque pretendía expresar la plenitud del perdón de Dios que no conoce límites.

El sacramento de la Penitencia nos asegura que Dios quita nuestros pecados. Resuenan con su carga de consuelo las palabras del Salmo: «Él perdoná todas tus culpas y cura todas tus dolencias; rescata tu vida del sepulcro, te corona de amor y de ternura.» (Sal 103,3-4.8.10-12). La Reconciliación sacramental no es sólo una hermosa oportunidad espiritual, sino que representa un paso decisivo, esencial e irrenunciable para el camino de fe de cada uno. En ella permitimos que Señor destruya nuestros pecados, que sane nuestros corazones, que nos levante y nos abrace, que nos muestre su rostro tierno y compasivo. No hay mejor manera de conocer a Dios que dejándonos reconciliar con Él (cf. 2 Co 5,20), experimentando su perdón. Por eso, no renunciemos a la Confesión, sino redescubramos la belleza del sacramento de la sanación y la alegría, la belleza del perdón de los pecados. Sin embargo, como sabemos por experiencia perso-

nal, el pecado “deja huella”, lleva consigo unas consecuencias; no sólo exteriores, en cuanto consecuencias del mal cometido, sino también interiores, en cuanto «todo pecado, incluso venial, entraña apego desordenado a las criaturas que es necesario purificar, sea aquí abajo, sea después de la muerte, en el estado que se llama Purgatorio». Por lo tanto, en nuestra humanidad débil y atraída por el mal, permanecen los “efectos residuales del pecado”. Estos son removidos por la indulgencia, siempre por la gracia de Cristo, el cual, como escribió san Pablo VI, es «nuestra “indulgencia”»....

Esa experiencia colma de perdón no puede sino abrir el corazón y la mente a perdonar. Perdonar no cambia el pasado, no puede modificar lo que ya sucedió; y, sin embargo, el perdón puede permitir que cambie el futuro y se viva de una manera diferente, sin rencor, sin ira ni venganza. El futuro iluminado por el perdón hace posible que el pasado se lea con otros ojos, más serenos, aunque estén aún surcados por las lágrimas.”
