SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

MAY 25, 2025

Sixth Sunday of Easter: Commentary

1. First Reading: Acts 15:1-2, 22-29

The state of the question was: should a gentile become a Jew first before he got baptized in Christ? Luke's answer was NO! He placed this problematic right at the center of his Acts to emphasize the development of the early Christian Church. Two centers of Christianity were emerging: the city of Jerusalem where the roots of the Church began, and the city of Antioch which opened up the Church to the whole world. Luke has presented to us today the primacy of Jerusalem where the Council of Jerusalem was held, and at the same time and equally the dynamism of the Church of Antioch. In Jerusalem, there was the rootedness of Christianity in Judaism: Jesus was a Jew. The tendency was to observe Christianity and Church practice from the Jewish perspective, its rituals, traditions and laws, such as the circumcision as the mark of the chosen people and of salvation. On the other hand, there was Antioch, a more cosmopolitan mix of Jewish Christians, Greek and other Gentile converts to Christianity. Their life was more pluralistic and multicultural, accepting each other in an intentional intercultural encounter. The link between these two types of Christianity – Jewish Christianity and the inculcated intercultural Christianity was Jesus: his suffering, death and resurrection that shattered all kinds of exclusivism and division caused by race, laws, customs, traditions and social classes. Take note that about 30 to 40 years after the Jesus event the Gentile converts passed from being the minority to being now the majority in the Church still run by Jewish Christians. The leaders of both centers had to meet at the Council of Jerusalem to resolve the issue. Luke always insisted that these developments and the decisions the Council made were the works of the Holy Spirit. After much discussions and debate – first as plenary and then as a group represented by the leaders of Jerusalem and the delegates of Antioch – Peter rose to pronounce the decision: the discernment through the Holy Spirit. The memory of Jesus was in danger of being lost in Jerusalem: the option for the poor and the marginalized. In the Council of Jerusalem the Hellenist and Gentile Christians were discriminated, the poor and the marginalized. They should be put back in the center, to recover and fulfill the memory and spirit of Jesus! "If God has chosen them, who are we to marginalize and exclude them?" The birth of an intercultural Church was affirmed by the Council of Jerusalem, thanks to Peter's leadership and the working of the Holy Spirit.

2. Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 67:2-3, 5, 6, 8

This is a psalm of blessing and praise. Sung by an Aaronic priest, it uses the subject "we", thus democratizing the

blessings as expressed in Num 6:24-26. All good things come from God; his universality is characterized by equality of all peoples.

3. Second Reading: Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

The New Jerusalem has come. It is characterized by the number 12, a cube of perfect geometric dimensions. This is the City of God built under the apostles. It is a city of precious gems. Its doors are always open for all who seek and accept the salvation of God through faith in Jesus. Inside it is a new paradise, with the trees of eternal life for its inhabitants. In this new City of Peace, there is no temple because its Temple is the Lord God and Jesus the lamb. God's glory is the Light and Jesus is the Lamp for all creation!

4. Gospel: John 14:23-29


This is a new way of life for all who believe and follow Jesus: a life in the Spirit. This is the first promise of the gift of the Holy Spirit to those who dare to belong to Jesus. The measure of one's new life from hereon is this: to love Jesus and the Father is obedience to Jesus and his word. This makes every Christian the dwelling place of God, and not just creatures in his image and likeness. And more: the Christian community will not be left orphans. They will be made one, strengthened, inspired and animated by the Holy Spirit. Thus, the Christian community is being prepared by Jesus for that struggle which himself will face: the struggle between the empires of this world with its hatred and readiness to kill, on the one hand, and God's Reign, his radical love and enthusiasm for life, on the other. – Fr. Ben, MSC

SEXTO DOMINGO DE PASCUA

MAYO 25, 2025

Sexto Domingo de Pascua

Comentario

1. Primera Lectura: Hechos 15:1-2, 22-29

La cuestión planteada era: ¿debía un gentil convertirse al judaísmo antes de ser bautizado en Cristo? ¡La respuesta de Lucas fue NO! Situó esta problemática en el centro de sus Hechos para enfatizar el desarrollo de la Iglesia cristiana primitiva. Dos centros del cristianismo estaban emergiendo: la ciudad de Jerusalén, donde se originaron las raíces de la Iglesia, y la ciudad de Antioquía, que la abrió al mundo entero. Lucas nos presenta hoy la primacía de Jerusalén, donde se celebró el Concilio de Jerusalén, y al mismo tiempo, el dinamismo de la Iglesia de Antioquía. En Jerusalén, el cristianismo tenía sus raíces en el judaísmo: Jesús era judío. La tendencia era observar el cristianismo y la práctica de la Iglesia desde la perspectiva judía, sus rituales, tradiciones y leyes, como la circuncisión como señal del pueblo elegido y de la salvación. Por otro lado, estaba Antioquía, una mezcla más cosmopolita de cristianos judíos, griegos y otros gentiles conversos al cristianismo. Su vida era más pluralista y multicultural, aceptándose mutuamente en un encuentro intercultural intencional. El vínculo entre estos dos tipos de cristianismo —el cristianismo judío y el cristianismo intercultural inculturado— era Jesús: su sufrimiento, muerte y resurrección, que destrozó todo tipo de exclusivismo y división causados por la raza, las leyes, las costumbres, las tradiciones y las clases sociales. Cabe destacar que unos 30 o 40 años después del acontecimiento de Jesús, los gentiles conversos pasaron de ser minoría a ser ahora mayoría en la Iglesia, aún dirigida por cristianos judíos. Los líderes de ambos centros tuvieron que reunirse en el Concilio de Jerusalén para resolver el asunto. Lucas siempre insistió en que estos acontecimientos y las decisiones del Concilio fueron obra del Espíritu Santo. Tras largas discusiones y debates —primero en plenaria y luego como grupo representado por los líderes de Jerusalén y los delegados de Antioquía—, Pedro se levantó para pronunciar la decisión: el discernimiento a través del Espíritu Santo. La memoria de Jesús corría el peligro de perderse en Jerusalén: la opción por los pobres y marginados. En el Concilio de Jerusalén, los cristianos helenistas y gentiles eran los discriminados, los pobres y marginados. Debían ser reubicados en el centro, para recuperar y materializar la memoria y el espíritu de Jesús. «Si Dios los ha elegido, ¿quiénes somos nosotros para marginarlos y excluirlos?». El nacimiento de una Iglesia intercultural fue afirmado por el Concilio de Jerusalén, gracias al liderazgo de Pedro y a la obra del Espíritu Santo.

2. Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 67:2-3, 5, 6, 8

Este es un salmo de bendición y alabanza. Cantado por un sacerdote aarónico, utiliza el sujeto «nosotros», democratizan-

zando así las bendiciones expresadas en Números 6:24-26. Todo lo bueno proviene de Dios; su universalidad se caracteriza por la igualdad de todos los pueblos.

3. Segunda Lectura: Apocalipsis 21:10-14, 22-23

La Nueva Jerusalén ha llegado. Se caracteriza por el número 12, un cubo de perfectas dimensiones geométricas. Esta es la Ciudad de Dios construida bajo el mandato de los apóstoles. Es una ciudad de piedras preciosas. Sus puertas están siempre abiertas para todos los que buscan y aceptan la salvación de Dios mediante la fe en Jesús. En su interior se encuentra un nuevo paraíso, con los árboles de la vida eterna para sus habitantes. En esta nueva Ciudad de Paz, no hay templo, porque su Templo es el Señor Dios y Jesús, el cordero. ¡La gloria de Dios es la Luz y Jesús es la Lámpara de toda la creación!

4. Evangelio: Juan 14,23-29

Esta es una nueva forma de vida para todos los que creen y siguen a Jesús: una vida en el Espíritu. Esta es la primera promesa del don del Espíritu Santo a quienes se atreven a pertenecer a Jesús. La medida de nuestra nueva vida a partir de ahora es esta: amar a Jesús y al Padre es obediencia a Jesús y a su palabra. Esto convierte a cada cristiano en la morada de Dios, y no solo en criaturas a su imagen y semejanza. Y más aún: la comunidad cristiana no quedará huérfana. Se hará una, fortalecida, inspirada y animada por el Espíritu Santo. Así, Jesús prepara a la comunidad cristiana para la lucha que él mismo enfrentará: la lucha entre los imperios de



CHIA SẺ TIN MỪNG

Chuyên gia tâm lý học, Jonathan Haidt, đã viết cuốn sách có tựa đề “Thế Hệ Lo Âu” năm 2024, lập luận rằng thanh thiếu niên ngày nay được đánh dấu bằng mức giá tăng đáng kể về sự lo âu, như tiêu đề gợi ý. Điện thoại thông minh, phương tiện truyền thông xã hội, sự bất ổn kinh tế, sự hỗn loạn của đại dịch toàn cầu, nỗi sợ hãi về khí hậu biến đổi và cái gọi là “cuộc khủng hoảng ý nghĩa” đều góp phần gây ra mức độ lo lắng cao đáng kinh ngạc nơi giới trẻ tuổi ngày nay. Tôi lớn tuổi hơn thế hệ này một chút, nhưng tôi cũng cảm thấy như vậy. Thế giới có lẽ phải chịu đựng quá sức.

Phúc âm tuần này đưa ra một giải pháp tuyệt vời cho những tâm hồn đang gặp rắc rối. Đối với các môn đồ choáng ngợp và tràn đầy lo âu của mình, Chúa Giêsu Phục Sinh nói: “Thầy để lại bình an cho các con; Thầy ban bình an của Thầy cho các con” (Gioan 14:27). Ông bình an của Người là sự bình an của Đấng đã bị đè bẹp trên thập tự giá và sau đó đã chiến thắng sự chết bằng sức mạnh của thần tính Người, mối dây tình yêu của Người với Thiên Chúa Cha. Người ban cho chúng ta sự bình an không thể lay chuyển này.

Lẽ tất nhiên, vì Chúa Giêsu phục sinh, căn bệnh tâm thần không biến mất một cách kỳ diệu. Nhưng Người đồng hành với chúng ta và ban cho chúng ta sự bình an của Người giữa những đau khổ của chúng ta. Sự bình an mà thế gian ban tặng, nó yếu đuối, không chắc chắn và tự tạo ra không giống như sự bình an của Chúa Giêsu. Sự bình an của Chúa Giêsu mạnh mẽ, chắc chắn và được ban tặng như một món quà từ Thiên Chúa. Người ban tặng món quà cho chúng ta giữa sự lo lắng của chúng ta. Bạn có nhận ra huệ này như một món quà không? Tôi hy vọng là có. Người muốn lấp đầy trái tim của thế hệ này bằng sự bình an của Người.

From the Pastor's Pen



Pope Leo XIV in the tradition of Pope Leo I to Pope Leo XIII.

1. Pope St. Leo I, the Great (440-461). He was the 45th Pope of the Catholic Church. Leo was his birth name. He convinced Atilla the Hun not to invade Italy.

2. Pope St. Leo II (682-683). He was the 80th Pope. He was a singer and promoted singing in the church. He approved the Acts of the 6th Council of Constantinople (680) and engaged positively the emperors of Constantinople.


3. Pope St. Leo III (795-816), the 96th Pope. His relationship with the Holy Roman Emperor Charlemagne had kept temporal and ecclesiastical powers of the papacy intact. He also promoted relations between the Church and the Eastern Empire.

4. Pope St. Leo VI (847-855), 103rd Pope. As Bishop of Rome he was also ruler of Papal Estates. He built the Leonine Wall around the Vatican Hill, and organized the defensive league of Italian cities against the Saracens.

5. Pope Leo V (903-904), the 118th Pope. Living in the dark era of the 9th century, he held little political authority.

6. Pope Leo VI (928), the 124th Pope. As Pope and temporal ruler of the Papal Estates, he had to confront divisions among bishops and the menace of Arab raiders that harassed Papal Estates and threatened Rome. Like the era of Pope Leo V, he was Pope in the dark ages.

7. Pope Leo VII (936-939), the 126th Pope. He allowed land grants to noble families and the ex-

pulsion of the Jewish people from Germany.

8. Pope Leo VIII (963-964), the 132nd Pope. He claimed the Papal Throne against rival popes John XII and Benedict V. His first term as pope (963-964) was considered by the Catholic Church as illegal, and for this he was called the antipope. His second term (June 23, 964 until his death) through appointment by the Holy Roman Emperor Otto I of Germany was considered legitimate.

9. Pope St. Leo IX (1049-1054), the 152nd Pope. He was lord of Papal Estates and bishop of Rome at the same time. Universally recognized as the most important German Pontiff, his reign started the Great Schism (1054) that separated the Roman Catholic Church and the Orthodox Church.

10. Pope Leo X (1513-1521), the 217th Pope. One of the 4 popes of the rich and powerful Medici family, his papacy flourished in the period of the Renaissance. The reshaping of European Christianity began, in the spirit of the Renaissance.

11. Pope Leo XI (1605), the 232nd Pope. Scion of the Medici family of Florence. He chose St. Philip Neri as his spiritual mentor.

12. Pope Leo XII (1823-1829), the 252nd Pope. In the midst of post-Napoleonic Wars, he reaffirmed Church authority and influence over the rising secularism and liberalism of the time.

13. Pope Leo XIII (1878-1903), the 256th Pope. He began the new era of the Church in the new era of the rise of Capitalism, Socialism and Communism and impact of the first and second Industrial Revolutions by addressing the pervading social order through his Social Encyclical Rerum Novarum.

What could we glean from this history and tradition of the 14 popes named Leo? – Fr. Ben, MSC

Pensamientos del Párroco




Papa León XIV, en la tradición del Papa León I al Papa León XIII.

1. Papa San León I el Grande (440-461). Fue el 45.^º Papa de la Iglesia Católica. León era su nombre de nacimiento. Convenció a Atila el Huno de no invadir Italia.
2. Papa San León II (682-683). Fue el 80.^º Papa. Fue cantante y promovió el canto en la iglesia. Aprobó las Actas del VI Concilio de Constantinopla (680) y se comprometió positivamente con los emperadores de Constantinopla.
3. Papa San León III (795-816), el 96.^º Papa. Su relación con el emperador Carlomagno del Sacro Imperio Romano Germánico mantuvo intactos los poderes temporales y eclesiásticos del papado. También promovió las relaciones entre la Iglesia y el Imperio de Oriente.
4. Papa San León VI (847-855), 103.^º Papa. Como obispo de Roma, también fue gobernante de los Estados Pontificios. Construyó la Muralla Leonina alrededor de la Colina Vaticana y organizó la liga defensiva de las ciudades italianas contra los sarracenos.

5. Papa León V (903-904), el 118.^º Papa. Vivió en la época oscura del siglo IX, por lo que ejerció poca autoridad política.

6. Papa León VI (928), el 124.^º Papa. Como Papa y gobernante temporal de los Estados Pontificios, tuvo que enfrentarse a las divisiones entre los obispos y a la amenaza de los invasores árabes que acosaban los Estados Pontificios y amenazaban a Roma. Al igual que en la época del Papa



León V, fue Papa en la Edad Media.

7. Papa León VII (936-939), el 126.^º Papa. Permitió la concesión de tierras a familias nobles y la expulsión del pueblo judío de Alemania.
 8. Papa León VIII (963-964), el 132.^º Papa. Reclamó el Trono Papal contra los papas rivales Juan XII y Benedicto V. Su primer mandato como papa (963-964) fue considerado ilegal por la Iglesia Católica, por lo que se le llamó antipapa. Su segundo mandato (del 23 de junio de 964 hasta su muerte), nombrado por el emperador del Sacro Imperio Romano Germánico Otón I de Alemania, fue considerado legítimo.
 9. Papa San León IX (1049-1054), el 152.^º Papa. Fue señor de los Estados Pontificios y obispo de Roma al mismo tiempo. Reconocido universalmente como el pontífice alemán más importante, su reinado dio inicio al Gran Cisma (1054) que separó a la Iglesia Católica Romana de la Iglesia Ortodoxa.
 10. Papa León X (1513-1521), el 217.^º Papa. Uno de los cuatro papas de la rica y poderosa familia Medici, su papado floreció durante el Renacimiento. Comenzó la remodelación del cristianismo europeo, en el espíritu del Renacimiento.
 11. Papa León XI (1605), 232.^º Papa. Vástago de la familia Medici de Florencia. Eligió a San Felipe Neri como su mentor espiritual.
 12. Papa León XII (1823-1829), 252.^º Papa. En medio de las guerras posnapoleónicas, reafirmó la autoridad e influencia de la Iglesia sobre el creciente secularismo y liberalismo de la época.
 13. Papa León XIII (1878-1903), 256.^º Papa. Inauguró la nueva era de la Iglesia en la era del auge del capitalismo, el socialismo y el comunismo, y el impacto de la primera y la segunda revolución industrial, abordando el orden social dominante mediante su encíclica social *Rerum Novarum*.
